Re: Request include maximum hospitals under PPN (net work) throughout the country.

We would like to draw your kind attention on our letter of 12th June, 20 on the above subject.

It's almost about a month and we find no action is taken by GIPSA to include maximum number of hospitals all over the country. We expected you must have initiated action seeing the urgency of the matter with present TPA, HITPA. But we observe you have preferred to ignore such genuine demand from us.

What pains us to write is that you never acknowledge any of our letters written to you on several occasions. Why such treatment is meted to us? Is it because we are retired and now Pensioners?

You are well aware even in Central Government whenever you address a letter to a particular department there is a system of acknowledging the letter with ref no and they convey that you will be informed about the status within a month. We would like to add here every pensioner has contributed their Sweat & Blood for the progress of the four PSGI companies and GICRe. We are equally concerned about the present status of the companies and wish to extend our help to improve the position in the present market standings.

Today, net work hospitals are insufficient and for retirees cashless hospitals are absolutely necessary. Retirees cannot arrange Fifty thousand or more suddenly for admission in hospital. Particularly as Senior Citizens are more vulnerable to any virus related ailments and should refrain from venturing outdoors due to the Corona virus and hospitals are charging in an unscrupulous way toward the treatment bills, we find on many occasions pensioners are refused by the hospitals at the time of admission as they demand hefty deposit.

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Under the circumstances we once again request you to take up the matter on top priority and advice HITPA to start negotiating with maximum hospitals in the country to come under network particularly in view of the General Insurance Council having come up with rates for hospitals and Insurers for Covid-19 treatment following talks with Sate Governments and Health Experts.

We shall appreciate if you take a pragmatic and positive approach in this connection.
